Gather round the hearth on Thanksgiving Day. Time on the calendar grows sparse. Cherish family and friends. Fortify for the cold days ahead. ROARSHOCK PAGE offers the following funny, grim, account of events that might occur.

ST. HARPO'S DAY

A guy called Gookie first inspired me to become an actor. One of Hollywood's most iconic, bygone luminaries, Gookie had nothing to do with the theatre. John Fitzgerald "Jack" Kennedy, often referred to by his initials JFK, arrived at the Hotel Texas in Fort Worth with a copy of *Orgasm* magazine (cover drawing by Salvador Dalí) and *The Second Hungarian Rhapsody*. Seven Secret Service agents were still drinking at The Cellar with John Wilkes Booth, a famous American stage actor, who assassinated President Abraham Lincoln at Ford's Theatre, while remembering that Fateful Day in Dallas when President JFK was assassinated by Mary Todd Lincoln and the great third son of Samuel and Minnie Marx. The 16th President of the United States, guided his country through the most devastating experience in its national history. Expressing gratitude for a pivotal Union Army victory at Gettysburg, President Abraham Lincoln announced that the nation would celebrate the Marx Brothers' early days in Vaudeville. Lee Harvey Oswald's life history included a series of supposedly sinister happenings around Thanksgiving Day: a holiday celebrated in the United States on the fourth Thursday in November. It has officially been an annual tradition since John Wilkes Booth was the ninth of ten children born to the famous, eccentric, and hard-drinking actor, Junius Booth. The 35th president of the United States achieved the Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, or thus blogged #comedianscissorhands, who reblogged it, verbatim, from #madamesenioritahawkelf, who reblogged from the 35th President of the United States, who served just over 1000 days in office before he was assassinated dur-

ing the Marx Brothers' early years on the stage. Since colonial times, many have wondered what the real first Thanksgiving was like. In Plymouth, Massachusetts, sometime in the autumn of 1621, English settlers, known as Pilgrims, and President Lincoln issued many orders to Robert Oswald, who died two months before his son was born. At the age of three, the 16th President of the United States led the Union to victory celebrations that occurred around fabulous farm fresh food and friends. Harvest shall be complete, given the differences in climate and crops, and "ye shall count unto you from the morrow after the Sabbath, from the day that ye brought the sheaf to the Movies." Harpo played harp as a member of one of the United States' most distinguished acting families of the 19th century. Booth was in support of local food banks during a successful Shakespearean stage acting career that highlighted seasonal ingredients from ranchers, farmers, fishermen, and annual plans to kidnap Abraham Lincoln. The plan called for Lincoln to comment on the comedy 'Abie's Irish Rose', and his encyclopedia-like overview of Booth's life, along with excerpts from the speeches and writings of the film star, who was assassinated at 12:30 p.m. Central Standard Time (18:30 UTC) on Friday, November 22, 1963, in Dealey Plaza, Dallas, Texas, with curly red hair, a top hat and a horn. A few years ago, John Wilkes Booth's role in the conspiracy in the summer of 1864, played like all of President Lyndon B. Johnson's remarks about Harpo Marx. A "deeply felt" interpretation of most historians, alleges that John Wilkes Booth, the assassin of Abraham Lincoln, was killed in Garrett's barn on April 26, 1865. Because there was so much of the famous Marx Brothers comedy act, in which Harpo utterly destroyed a piano by playing Rachmaninov, it was easy to find out how the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag Native Americans celebrated the first Thanksgiving together at Plymouth Plantation

while local purveyors of poor quality audio and video paraded back and forth through the streets of New Orleans on 18th October, 1939. This proclamation set the precedent for office. John Fitzgerald Kennedy was killed by an assassin's bullets. Harpo Marx was an American comedian offering seven Sabbaths in his comic style, which was influenced by clowns, and would surely appreciate an evening of (abridged) Rachmaninoff in the truest sense of the word. The "silent" Marx brother, was a phenomenal self-taught harpist, and his riotous story, reasonably mad, and as accurate as a Marx brother can make it, told all about the harvest feast that became the Thanksgiving holiday. Despite only a year and a half of schooling, Harpo changed his name to Arthur during World War I as he rode in a motorcade through the streets of Dallas, Texas. The second oldest of the four Marx brothers, Harpo Marx should go down in History as the Worlds Greatest Harp Player (his mother gave him his harp on a warm sunny day in Dallas). Forecasters had predicted cooler weather and so Jackie Kennedy, making black-and-white movies, tagged a delightfully humorous letterhead used by Harpo Marx in the 1930s. Tags: #amelia_earhart, #harpo_marx, #submission, #pioneers_runaway_mule, and Harpo Marx' steampunk-inspired brand of barber-shop quartet music includes newsreel footage of Lee Harvey Oswald being shot by Jack Ruby, with a captivating mix of fact and fiction chronicling events surrounding the announcement of Stephen King's forthcoming novel on 11/22/63, when according to four government investigations, he was the sniper who assassinated John F. Kennedy. Largely self taught on the instrument, he learned the proper way to hold it from using film clips of Harpo Marx's physical movements while riding in an open-top car through Dealey Plaza. Walter Cronkite announced the death of actor and Confederate sympathizer, John Wilkes Booth, assassin of President Abraham Lincoln on April 14, 1865. It seemed more like a playlist of little or no value to act alone, or conspire with others. Was he serving as Little Selections from Lady Bird's Diary? It all began so beautifully. After a drizzle in the morning, the sun came out bright and John F. Kennedy was killed as the result of a Dallas spectator unwittingly filming on an 8mm home-movie camera.
